Program overview

RST have developed a new qualification using agricultural technology tools and processes. This training is designed for students experienced or wanting to enter into pork production. It is also suitable if you are interested already working in industry but want to upskill or be employed as:

- > Piggery attendant
- > Stockperson
- > Farm hand

Regional Skills Training (RST) utilises both in-house educators and local pork industry experts to deliver these topics which are relevant to pork production and to local farming areas.

Graduates from this qualification will gain a broad understanding skills and knowledge that enables them to gain employment within multiple aspects of the pork industry.

- > AHCPRK204 Care for weaner pigs
- > AHCPRK206 Conduct outdoor pig operations
- > AHCPRK305 Care for grower and finisher pigs
- > AHCPRK306 Monitor and maintain outdoor pig production
- > RIIHAN309F Conduct telescopic materials handler operations
- > AHCMOM310 Operate land forming machinery and equipment
- > HLTAID003 Provide first aid

Funding and eligibility information

Delivery regions

For groups of 15 people or more, RST will travel to your local region and conduct face to face workshops. Where possible, we will engage local industry experts to deliver some topics.

HOW MANY WORKSHOPS WILL THERE BE?

Generally, there will be around 12 workshop days.

WHAT IF I MISS A WORKSHOP?

We understand that sometimes it may not be possible for you to attend a workshop due to work, family or other commitments. You can easily catch up on missed topics using our online portal, webinars or one on one phone sessions.

HOW LONG DOES THE COURSE TAKE?

It takes 18 months to complete the AHC30416 Certificate III in Pork Production. When setting up group timetables and individual learning programs, we avoid workshops and assessments being due in busy times of the year.

DO I NEED TO COMPLETE A LANGUAGE, LITERACY AND NUMERACY ASSESSMENT TO ENROL?

As per the Standards for Registered Training Organisations 2015, registered training organisations (RTOs) are required to determine “the support needs of individual learners and provides access to the educational and support services necessary for the individual learner to meet the requirements of the training product”. As such, RST will request all non-school based students complete a language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) test upon enrolment. WorkReady funded students may also be required to complete an additional LLN test to meet funding body requirements.

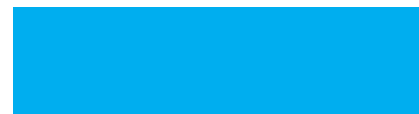
