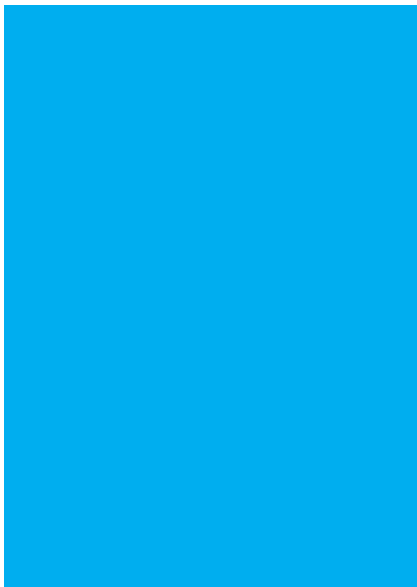

Regional Skills Training (RST) Ticketing and Licencing Program offers you the opportunity to upskill, gain tickets and develop a safe system of work.

This program is suited to all sectors across primary industries including broadacre cropping, livestock, pastoral, mixed farming enterprises, dairy, fruit and vegetable, viticulture, nurseries, irrigation and production horticulture.

RST can assist in your enrolment options and then select appropriate units for the chosen qualification.

Topics

MACHINERY OPERATIONS TICKETING

If you are interested in obtaining machinery operations competencies, you can undertake tickets as part of your course. You will need to have access to the appropriate machinery and be able to demonstrate operating the machine. Competency is achieved by successful completion of a self-paced theory and practical onsite assessment. Machines able to be assessed include;

- > Front end loader*
- > Civil articulated loader*
- > Skid steer*
- > Backhoe loader*
- > Excavator*
- > Telehandler*
- > Grader

RST has all machines marked with an asterisks (*) on-site at Watervalley Farm, Arthurton. If you are a competent machinery operator (tractor and front-end loader) then you may wish to attend our facility to complete the additional machinery operator tickets.

WORK, HEALTH AND SAFETY (WHS)

WHS is an integral part of every workplace with both employers and workers (family, volunteer or paid) being legally responsible under the Act.

RST believes that the most effective way to embed WHS into your workplace is by using a purpose build agricultural safety system.

You will be working with Safe Ag Systems to develop key components of your safety system. It will include:

- > Policies
- > Inductions
- > Safe Work procedures
- > Chemical register and application records
- > Machinery maintenance records
- > Worker training record
- > Safety Checklists
- > Hazard Maps
- > Machinery, tools, equipment registers with inbuilt records, notification of repairs, purchases
- > Jobs list and communication between all workers

FORKLIFT

Where sufficient demand is identified, forklift licence workshops will be held in local regions. These workshops will involve both theory and practical assessments. Where there is not adequate local demand, we will advise you of your closest workshop options. Please note the forklift course is for a licence. As such, the training and assessment process is a part of your enrolment but you must pay SafeWork SA for issuing the licence. This is payable to Service SA (the same process as paying for your driver's licence).

SAFELY RIDE QUAD BIKES

- > Completed via a self-paced theory plus a practical on-site assessment
- > Introduction to the hazards and risks in using quad bikes
- > What is safe operation
- > What is correct personal protective equipment
- > What you should never do on a quad bike

WELDING AND WORKSHOPS TOOLS

A 3 day practical and theory workshop, this topic is an introduction to farm welding processes and the use of relevant power and hand tools. For the beginner welder.

ADVANCED WELDING

A 3 day workshop for the competent farm welder to advance your skills. Will enable you to have the skills for retrofit, build from start, repair implements. An on farm project will need to be completed within 6 months of the workshop

MACHINERY MAINTENANCE

Completed via a 2 day practical and theory based workshop, you will learn basic machinery maintenance and care

of machines and engines, including small motors. For the beginner in machinery maintenance.

WORKING AT HEIGHTS AND IN CONFINED SPACES

Attend a 1 day theory and practical workshop to gain your ticket to work safely at heights and work in confined spaces. These tickets are important for people who work with field bins, silos, any heights such as roof maintenance, climbing ladders or any situation where falls could occur.

SPRAY SOLUTIONS CHEMICAL ACCREDITATION

For new or re-accreditations, completion of the Spray Solutions program enables you to purchase, transport, use and store S7 chemicals. Spray Solutions can be completed via different options which include open learning or face to face workshops. All training options require students to provide evidence of some practical activities completed in the workplace.

CHAINSAW

A 2 day practical and theory workshop:

- > Maintenance and servicing of your chainsaw
- > Chainsaw safety, cutting techniques and plenty of trimming and cutting practice
- > Obtain your chainsaw ticket on successful completion
- > Training and assessment is conducted by Logging Investigation and Training Association Inc (RTO Code 0577)

FIRST AID

Where sufficient demand is identified a 1 day first aid workshop will be held in local regions. These workshops involve both theory and practical assessments.

Core units of competency

Students enrolled in a qualification are required to complete the listed core units of competency to exit with a qualification.

- > AHCWHS301 **Contribute to work health and safety processes** (can be completed using Safe Ag Systems)
- > AHCWRK309 **Apply environmental sustainability work practices**

Funding and eligibility information – WorkReady

Subsidised training places are available subject to eligibility. A concession rate is available if you hold a valid concession card. Refer to the course fee sheet for cost details. Check your eligibility at www.skills.sa.gov.au.

Accessing WorkReady subsidies may impact your eligibility for future training subsidies.

Payment plans are available if needed.

Delivery regions

You can complete your training from anywhere in South Australia. Face to face workshops are conducted where sufficient demand is identified in your local region.

You can enrol and commence your training at any time.

WILL I NEED TO COMPLETE ASSESSMENTS?

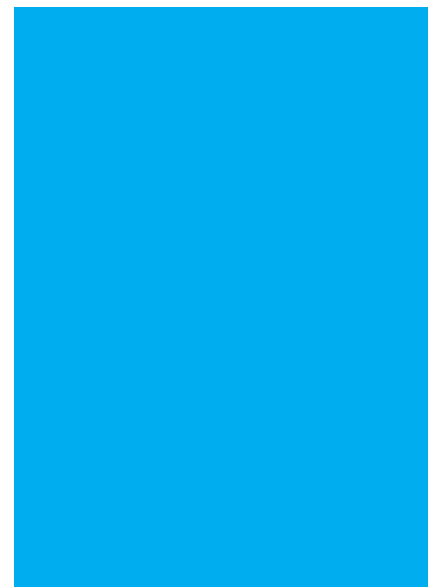
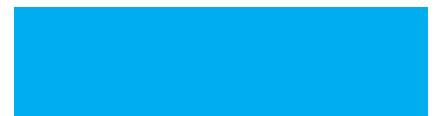
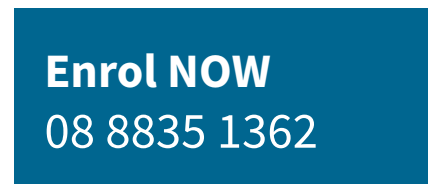
The Ticketing and Licencing Program assessment methods vary between topics. You may be required to complete theory and/or practical assessments, competency conversations, workplace demonstrations, or supply photo and video evidence.

DO I NEED TO COMPLETE A LANGUAGE, LITERACY AND NUMERACY ASSESSMENT TO ENROL?

As per state public funding and training standards, RTO's are required to determine the support needs for students. As such, RST requires all students to complete a snapshot of reading and numeracy indicator (SRNI) and suitability for the course (upfront assessment of need UAN) assessment at enrolment. Where language, literacy and numeracy barriers are identified, RST will provide student support.

HOW LONG WILL MY TRAINING TAKE?

On average to gain a qualification in ticketing and licencing, the timeframe is usually 18 months to 3 years, depending on the student needs and farming commitments. You are able to complete tickets and attend workshops at your own pace.
